

Panida Announces Lauren Sanders as New Managing Director

Lauren and her husband share deep generational roots in this beautiful area. Lauren is 7th generation Coeur d'Alene and while she wasn't born there, growing up

the family would spend every vacation in North Idaho and it imprinted on Lauren's heart. She recalls her grandfather Jim Elder's lifelong dedication to the Coeur d'Alene community. "My Papa was integral in the remodeling of McEuen Field and in the library update, and he served on the City Council for many years. Being a first-hand witness to his commitment to his community instilled in me the value of giving back to where you live." As she describes it, "North Idaho has been the most consistent place for me, it's my home." For 33 years her husband's family has enjoyed their cabin in Sagle on Lake Pend Oreille.

Lauren and her family officially moved to Sandpoint in 2021. She wanted to get involved in the Sandpoint community, "I was presented with a great opportunity to be the marketing manager for Kaniksu Community Health. I loved working there, it was a great opportunity to better understand the residents of Bonner and Boundary Counties."

Now she is deeply honored to bring her heart commitment to the community and her career accomplishments together to serve the historic Panida Theater.

"The Panida is a magical place that has been bringing our community together for nearly 100 years. I'm honored to be the Managing Director during this pivotal time as we near the Panida's 100-year anniversary in 2027," says Sanders. "The Panida is a place for our community to come together in a shared experience, and I hope to preserve what the Panida Moms had in mind while bringing to life the plans of the Century Fund that will restore and modernize the Panida so our community can enjoy it for the next 100 years!"

"These are exciting times for the Panida Theater as we move toward its 100th anniversary in 2027," says Healey. "Lauren is looking forward to the challenge of celebrating the first hundred years of the theater and launching the theater into its second hundred years."

The Panida is in the midst of a large community-driven fundraiser dubbed the Century Fund campaign, with the goal to raise \$1.9 million by 2027 in five phases in order to meet long-deferred maintenance and renovation needs of the historic building and its smaller sibling, the Little Theater. The first phase of the campaign, launched in October, has a goal to raise \$273,100 for funds needed to replace the theater roof.

"We're right at the threshold of meeting our first-year goal," says Chris Bessler, chair of the Century Fund committee. "We're getting terrific community support, and I'm super happy to have Lauren coming on board to help lead the Century Fund."

About the Panida

The Panida opened as a vaudeville and movie house in 1927. It is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Built in Spanish Colonial Revival Style, it has been named by the Society of Architectural Historians as one of four architecturally significant theaters in Idaho.

After the theater fell into disrepair and faced demolition, in 1985 community members formed the nonprofit Panida Theater Committee and raised the funds to purchase it to be a performing arts center. The adjacent Little Theater was acquired in 2003 as a smaller performance venue and community meeting place.
